From the Committee

Conveners report

Hello Fellow Permies! and welcome to another year of PAWA activities.

We have made 'Local Heroes' our theme for the year as we wanted to recognise and learn from the many Western Australians who are pioneers of sustainability and landcare strategies and have been applying Permaculture principles successfully for a long time.

Whilst media interest in these topics has increased in recent years in response to the evidence of climate change and Peak Oil concerns, they are not new concepts! The Permaculture movement was founded 30 years ago in response to growing awareness of pollution, loss of plant and animal species, depletion of non renewable resources (particularly the oil shocks of '73 and '75) and a destructive economic system. Since then it has grown to become a worldwide movement. Western Australians, whether prominent internationally, or through work in local schools & community organisations, or just doing a great job of developing their own Permaculture systems have played a part in this. By showcasing the achievements of these people, we hope to bring the knowledge & benefits of Permaculture to people who are new to it, but nevertheless have motivation to reduce/ reuse/ recycle and live well!

Last year we conducted an online survey to seek feedback on various issues, but mainly the suitability of venue and meeting time. What we found was that more people were in favour of meeting on a weekend, and that for many, Bassendean was not central enough. So, to that end we have confirmed arrangements for our change of venue to City Farm, East Perth and the next meeting will be on **Saturday 11th April at 11:00am**. Jeremy Albertson will talk about and demonstrate the making and use of compost teas with a focus on using herbs as dynamic accumulators of nutrients

At this month's meeting on **Saturday 14th March** PAWA screened the DVD 'Garbage Warrior'. Unfortunately due to email problems we weren't able to announce this event widely. However the DVD – a documentary about a US architect who struggles with the law to build functional houses from junk materials is available from most DVD rentals and is well worth viewing.
